<u>COVID-19</u>

And so, it goes on....... Since the last Viewpoint, life has become a little less stressful. On a lighter note, work on both of our halls has progressed (see below) and we will all be glad of that.

Play Areas

For those with children, an expansion of the Play Area inspections reported in the Parish Council news below. Each year the Council commissions a safety inspection of our Play Areas. This is carried out by approved specialists who report their findings to the Council. This year's report is far more detailed than those previously received. Clearly, the inspection was more forensic and exacting than before. The report runs into 130 pages, addressing each area/item of equipment in detail, assigning a 'Risk Factor' together with recommendations for remedial action where appropriate. Parents will be pleased to know that NONE of our areas/items were anywhere near 'High Risk', with the highest being only 'Moderate Risk' and many being 'Low Risk'. The general assessment for each of the 3 areas was 'Moderate Risk'. The Council takes safety matters very seriously. A group of three Councillors are reviewing the report in detail to address the remedial action needed to ensure that all areas/items are brought up to a 'Low Risk' level. This group will draft a detailed and costed plan, which will be submitted to the full Council in the near future.


Your Council Needs YOU!

New Kitchen

While the hall has been shut the enlarged kitchen has taken shape, when it is finished it will be a lovely, light spacious area to work. It is twice the size of the old one, well equipped with modern appliances, an eye level oven with a slide under door, a modern hob, a boiling water dispenser for those endless cups of tea, and an enlarged hatchway into the hall for easier access.

This has made good use of the old bar area, allowing the storage of unused tables, chairs, etc., then the sliding doors to block it off will make the main area of the hall more pleasant to use, as it will be both tidier and safer.

Both the main hall and the smaller lower hall will be available to hire from the beginning of August, Sadly the new upper hall kitchen will be unavailable for use as we are awaiting the delivery of the worktops. This will not effect the hall use.

Parish Council News



Annual Play Inspections have been carried out on all three play areas in the parish. Any matters arising will be dealt with accordingly.

Council successfully held its second remote meeting in July. here will be no meeting in August. It is hoped that by September face-to-face meetings can be resumed. The September meeting is scheduled for Soudley and confirmation of thus will be on the relevant agenda displayed on parish notice boards and on the parish website (www.rspc.org.uk).

In the interim the Clerk is working from home and continues to deal with all matters relating to the parish.

<u>Skip in Ruspidge Recreation Field</u> – after many months of chasing, even prior to lockdown, the skip has eventually been collected. Latterly, the supplier Bell Waste refused to collect the overflowing skip due to COVID19 operational reasons, but council were able to procure the services of Lydney Skip Hire. The skip was not ordered by the council and despite requests to residents to stop dumping their personal rubbish the skip was overflowing and it should be noted that the costs incurred by the parish council will come from the parish precept of the council tax.

Grants – under Section 137 of the LGA 1972 the Council approved the following grants:

- Soudley Village Hall/Football Club £900 towards pitch maintenance and marking.
- Severn Area Rescue Association £250 to aid funds severely restricted by the pandemic.

Cinderford Northern Quarter (CNQ) is located on the northern edge of Cinderford, between the Forest Vale Industrial Estate, Steam Mills and the A4136. The site was formerly dominated by mining and other heavy industry but was later landscaped.

The availability of £14.75m awarded to the District under the National Coalfield Programme was used to formulate and support a scheme comprising a new 'Spine Road' (to by-pass Steam Mills), relocating the college from Five Acres, plus sites for housing, a hotel, offices and light industry.

Further grant funding has enabled the relocation of the college and construction of the first section of the Spine Road, which were opened in September 2018. Unfortunately, the road cost an extra £2.5m on top of the £3.8m contract price, due to ground conditions.

It was expected that this first phase of publicly funded development would attract private investment, but no development has taken place since 2018. So, what is happening now?

Forest of Dean District Council (FoDDC) have obtained a sustainable grant to fund making a new planning application. This application would allow development of the central area without completing the Spine Road and is expected to be submitted soon.

Two sites designated for employment have no need to wait for this, however, as they are already accessible by road. They have been marketed as the "Southern Gateway".

In April 2020, FoDDC advised that the cost estimates for the Southern Gateway were not viable and that the design team had been tasked to re-visit the design work with a focus on cost-effectiveness. This has now been done and a business case is expected to be discussed at FoDDC Cabinet in September and a decision made whether to proceed with more detailed design work and ultimately with construction, funded from Council borrowing.


The Council appointed a scrutiny task group to review the financial viability of the scheme, the likely delivery of new jobs, the interest in investment by the private sector and the success of the wildlife mitigation. However, this work had to stop as soon as it started, because of the pressure on local authority staff caused by the Covid-19 emergency. At the time of writing, only 'essential activity' is allowed officer support.
