Gloucestershire's recycling centres set to move to summer hours

Gloucestershire County Council's Household Recycling Centres (HRCs) will be switching to longer summer opening hours a week earlier than planned.

The centres are currently experiencing high levels of demand, which is believed to be due to the recent spell of fine weather.

To help meet the increased demand, summer opening hours will come into effect from Sunday 21 March instead of Sunday 28 March. They will be open from 9am to 5pm, instead of the shorter winter hours of 10am to 4pm.

Visitors to all household recycling centres need to pre-book their visit. Social distancing is required on site and to minimise queues and waiting times the number of booking slots available is limited.

Residents are asked to please keep to their appointment times to help to reduce queues.

Those with symptoms of COVID-19 or who are self-isolating must not visit and should stay at home, and follow the most up to date government and NHS advice.

Forest Lottery

The Forest Lottery was set up in 2019 by Forest of Dean District Council with 60 pence of every £1 ticket going to local causes. It is part of a national scheme and March saw the first big win in the Forest of Dean with £2,000 being won by a Coleford resident.

The draw takes place every Saturday night with results posted on online, although winners are also advised directly. The top prize is £25,000. To sign up and nominate which local organisation you will be raising funds for.

The Community Ownership Fund

The UK government has launched a new £150 million Community Ownership Fund.

Community groups will be able to bid for up to £250,000 matched-funding to help them buy or take over local community assets at risk of being lost, to run as community-owned businesses.

The first bidding round for the Community Ownership Fund will open by June 2021. A full bidding prospectus will be published alongside this.

Local authorities, including parish councils will not be eligible to bid, however Parish councils may play a role in working with community groups looking to submit a bid. https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/community-ownership-fund

Flood defence – an alternative to sandbags

Over recent years, our Parish has been the victim of a number of flooding events, with properties being flooded on multiple occasions - particularly in lower Soudley.

The District Council has have recently been looking into ways that we can support you and are currently looking into the possibility of providing town and parish councils with a number of FloodSax and/or Hydro snakes, which you can deploy as appropriate within your locality.

FloodSax are an alternative to sandbags. They are an eco-friendly, robust flood defence system, generally supplied in packs of five and cost around £32 per pack, although bulk buy discounts may be available. They are lightweight and easy to transport which makes deployment much easier, absorbing up to 22 litres of water per bag, the semi-porous inner liner contains a gelling polymer that absorbs water to expand and become firm in just over 3 minutes.

The District is considering making a bulk purchase and then offering them to FoD households at cost. Parishes have been asked to canvass residents in order to determine if there is a demand and estimate volumes for purchase.

Registering to vote

Anyone who wishes to vote must be registered on the electoral register. The deadline for those who are not registered to make an application is Monday 19 April. For more information and to register see: https://www.gov.uk/register-to-vote

Postal voting

For anyone interested in voting by post this year they just need to make sure they apply before 20 April 2021. They can request a postal vote application form by visiting https://www.fdean.gov.uk/about-the-council/elections-and-voting/register-to-vote/

We would encourage people to sign up to do this as quickly as possible.

Proxy voting

If a resident is unable to make it to the polling station, then they can nominate someone to be their proxy and cast their vote for them. The proxy needs to be a registered voter and able to attend the voter's own polling station. Applications for proxy voting need to be sent to the District Council by no later than 5pm on Tuesday 27 April.

Down to Earth Gloucestershire's Community Gardening Project at Cinderford Medical Centre was started when the new Medical Centre opened back in the Autumn of 2020 directly as a result of the growing awareness of the mental, physical and emotional health benefits of community gardening.

Our Facebook page, Down to Earth Cinderford (https://www.facebook.com/CinderfordMedicalCentre) shows our progress.

The main growing area for the volunteers is at the back of the centre, and the group are in the process of repurposing the whole area to grow food. They felt they wanted to contribute more to local communities helping them access fresh, organic vegetables and fruit, so with this in mind, the original 2 raised beds were far from sufficient. We also thought it would be a great idea to support people to help themselves by growing their own. To this end we are putting on a Forest Food Growing Fair, the first of many we hope.

Apart from sharing expertise, we want to have lots of seeds and seedlings available for people to take away with them in exchange for donations. We also want provide opportunities for seed saving groups, local gardening groups, and any other groups focussed on helping people grow their own to showcase what they do.

Soudley News



Wild Boar in Soudley

Following a query received by the Parish Office from a Soudley parishioner, this reply from Forestry England.

have been passed your query regarding the issue of feral wild boar and the impacts they are having in Soudley in particular.

The boar activity is guite seasonally dependent and is often driven by different food availability. In the late summer / early autumn there is an big increase in insect activity in the upper layers of the soil with an abundance of leatherjacket larvae being available. This often triggers an increase in the boar targeting grassland areas such as amenity grassland residents gardens and roadside verges. This activity often brings boar into residential areas where they can target this food source. They often pay repeat visits to the same areas once they have discovered a good food source, this tends to stop once that food source dries up or they find a better alternative area to feed somewhere new.

There is very little that can be done as amenity areas / grass verges cannot be protected by fencing. We strongly advise residents to protect their properties with adequate fences and keep their gates close to try to prevent the boar access to their gardens.

We are aware some people misguidedly put food out for the boar for a variety of reasons, this is both irresponsible and illegal. The boar don't need supplementary feeding and such acts draws them into communities which creates further problems. We also encourage residents to put their food waste bins out as close to collection as possible to prevent this acting as an attractant.

We are actively culling the boar all over the forest including in the Soudley area to reduce the number down to a level where their negative impacts are reduced and to enable residents to live alongside them with minimal problems. We have culled over 800 since the 1st April last year, and are continuing with that operation.

I continue to research alternative deterrents in an effort to find a non-lethal method or product that can be employed within the communities to try to ease the problems the animals create when straying into residential areas. I will pass on any relevant information or possible solutions as I obtain it.

I hope this information is of use. Ian Harvey, Wildlife Manager
